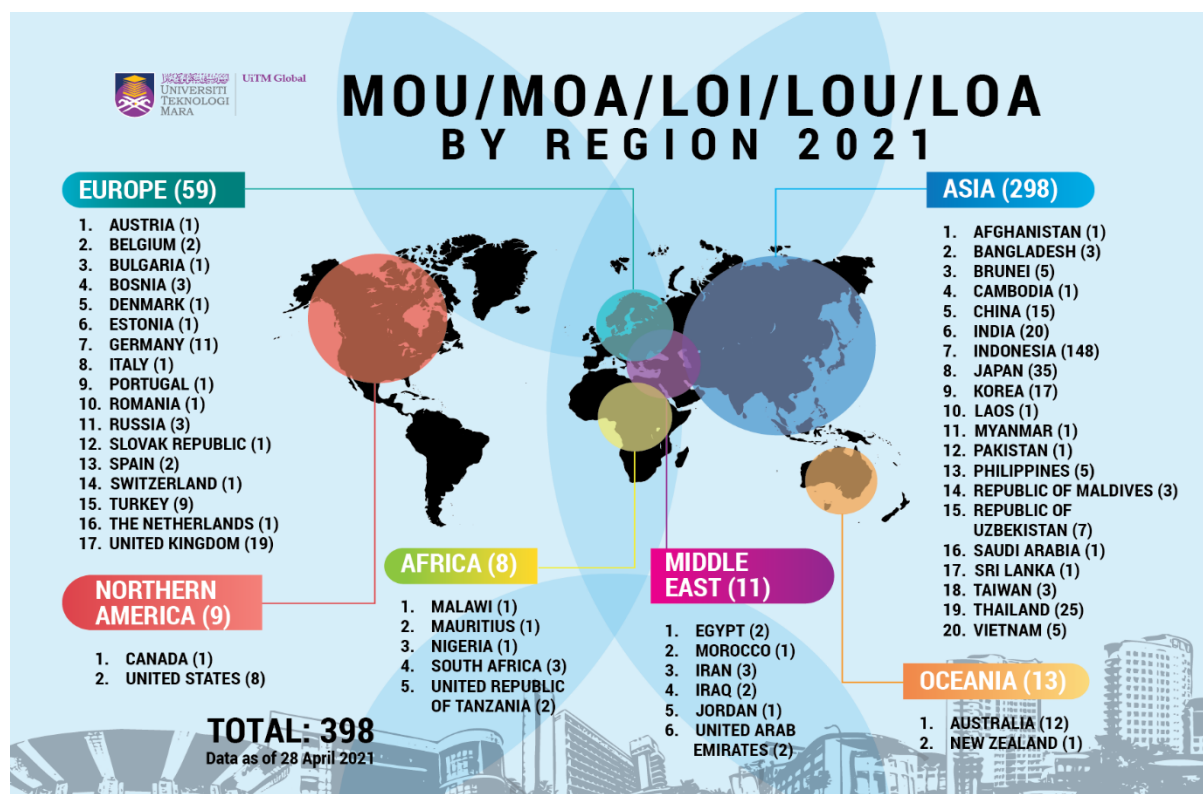

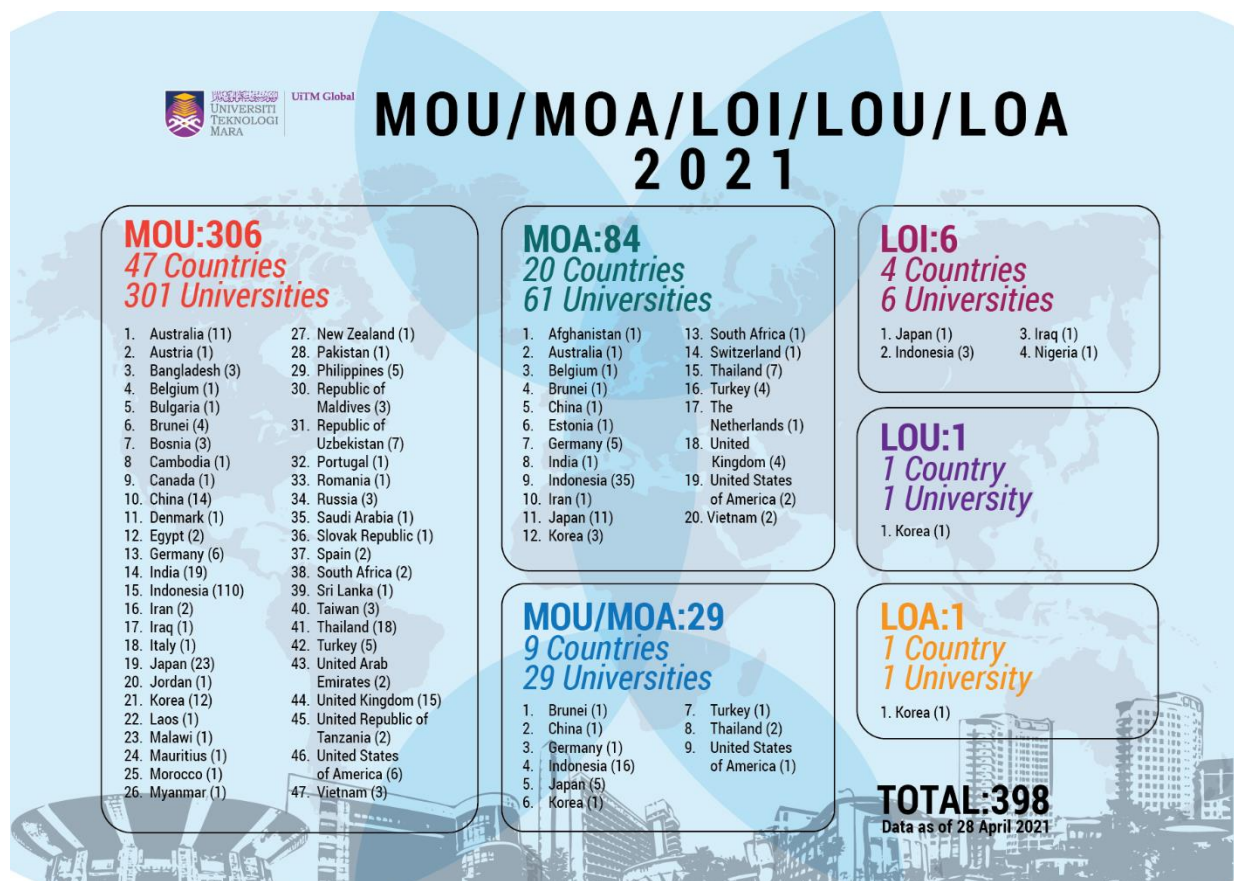

4. THE 14TH IMT-GT STRATEGIC PLANNING MEETING (30 APRIL)


On 30 April 2021, under the 'new norm', the 14th IMT-GT Strategic Planning Meeting (SPM) was held virtually, was attended by Dr Hajah Zainab Haji Mohd Noor, Director from the Department of International Affairs (DIA) as the person Focal Point Malaysia and DIA team. The meeting was chaired by Honourable Dr. Rizal Affandi Lukman, Deputy Minister for International Economic Cooperation, Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs – Indonesia, and Standing Chair of IMT-GT Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) was the host country for the meeting. The meeting was also attended by the Honnourable Dato' Ahmad Zamri Bin Khairuddin, Director Regional Development Division, Economic Planning Unit, Prime Minister's Department Malaysia, Honorable Dr. Wanchat Suwankitti, Deputy Secretary-General, Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) Thailand, Honourable Mr. Alfredo Perdiguero, Director Regional Cooperation and Operations Coordination Division, Southeast Asia Department, Mr. Firdaus Dahlan, Director of Centre for IMT-GT Subregional Cooperation, and chair of each IMT-GT Working Group. A total of 10 Working Groups (WGs), Sub-Working Group (SWG), JBC, and UNINET reports were presented. The Head of each WGs presented the outcome of the breakout discussion on Agriculture & Agro-based Industry ; Tourism ; Halal and Product Services ; Transport Connectivity ; ICT Connectivity ; Trade and Investment ; HRD, Education and Culture ; Environment ; UNINET and Joint Business Council(JBC) respectively. In addition, progress report on the preparation of IMT-GT Implementation Blueprint 2022-2026 IB Consultant / CIMT and IMT-GT Implementation Blueprint 2022-2026 were also presented. Other matters discussed to include Preparation of IMT-GT Implementation Blueprint 2022-2026 and Preparation of IMT-GT Summit and IMT-GT Ministerial Meeting.



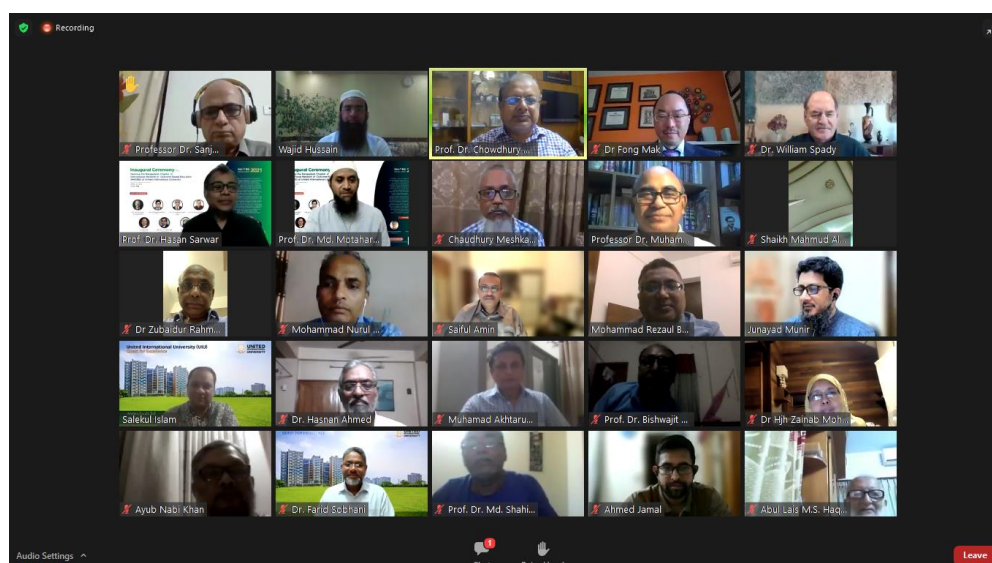

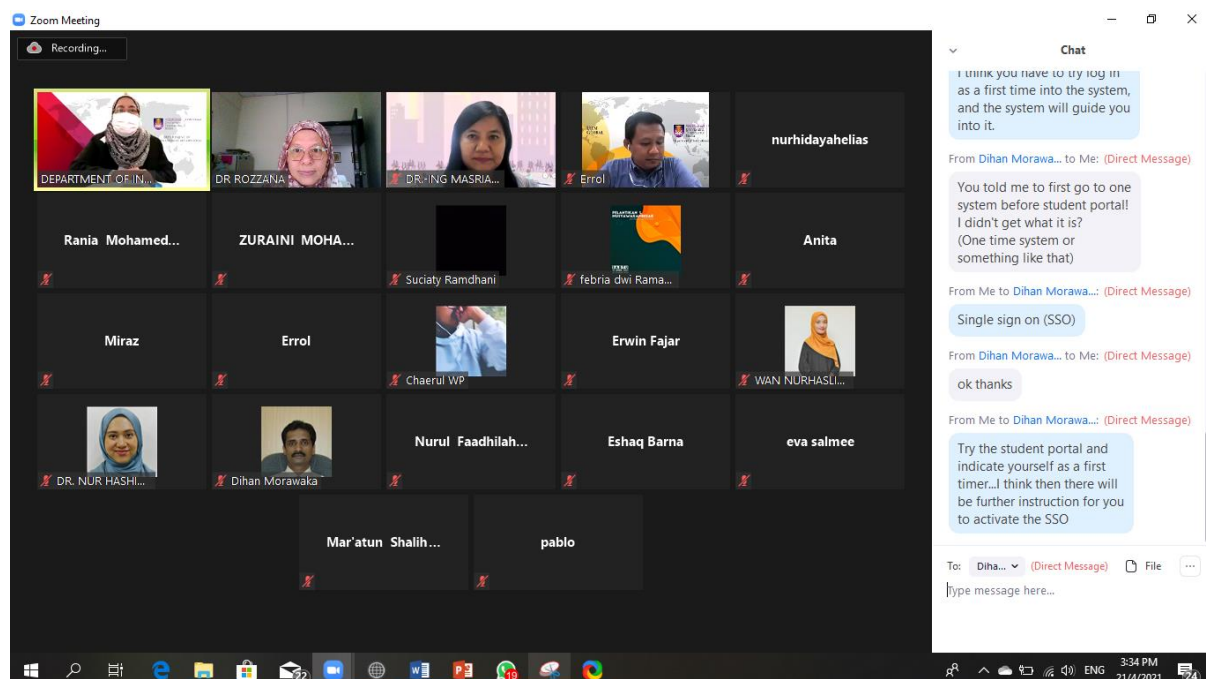
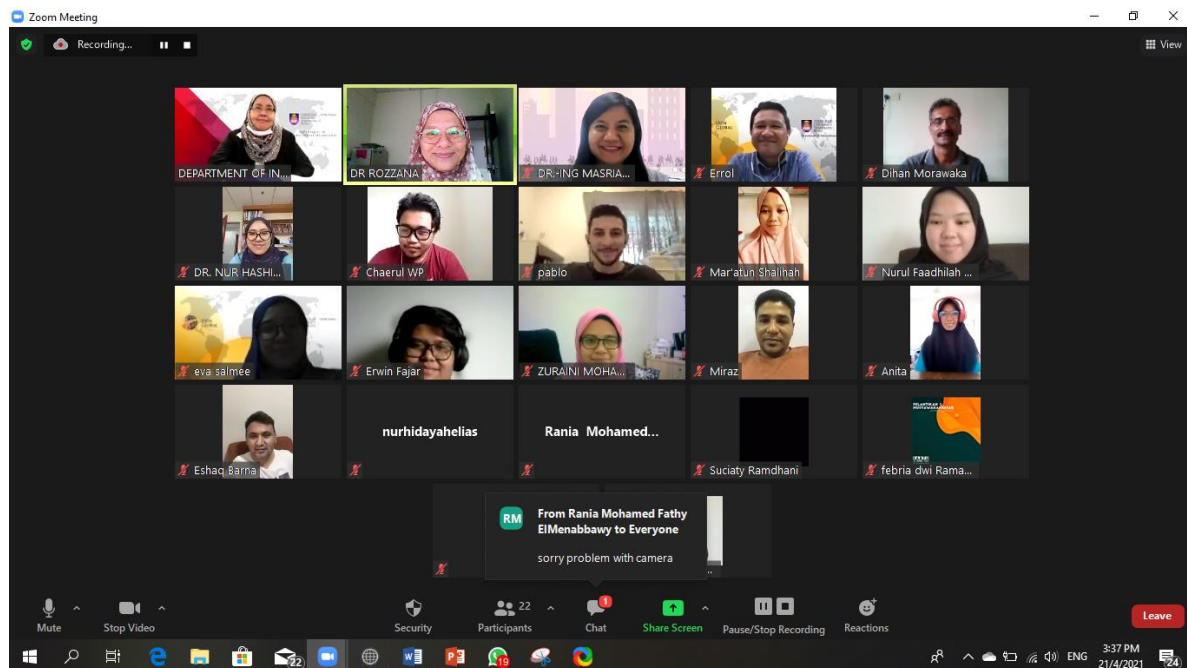
7. ISD CLINIC: A-Z ON MANAGING STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME 1/2021 (27 APRIL)

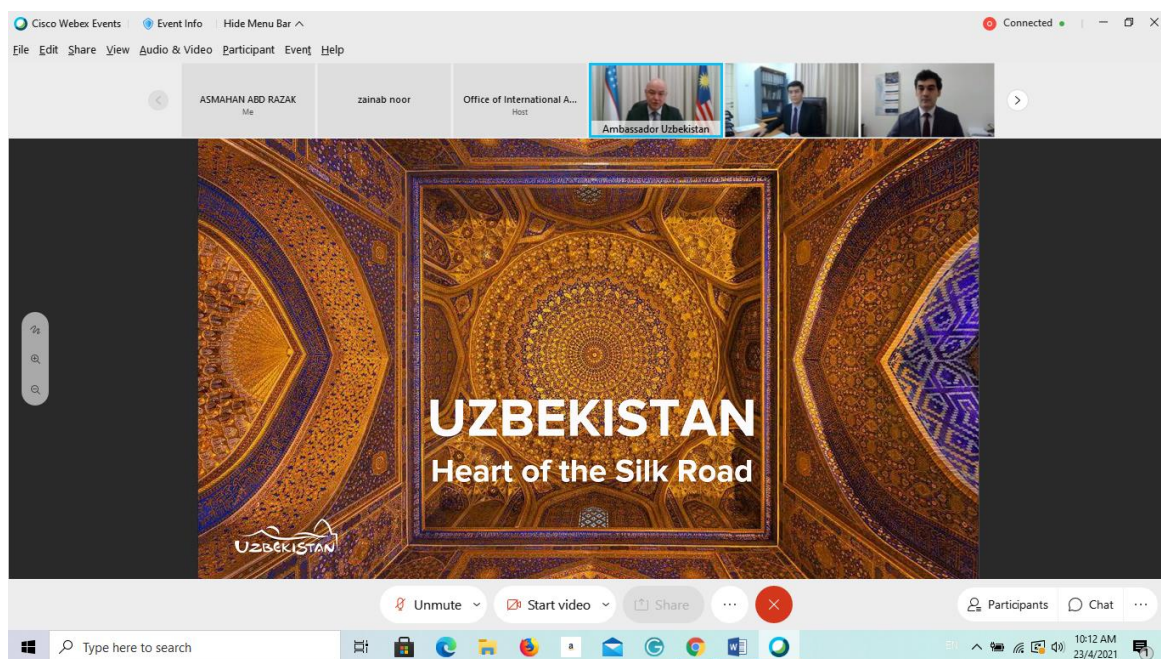
8.19TH MEET AND GREET SESSION (21 APRIL)

Connecticut Lacks in Sustainable Curriculum and Initiatives

- A bill was passed that collects the requirement for teaching climate change included in the next Generation Science Standards.
- Legislators in states argue against climate change curriculum and instead fail to teach students that climate change is human caused.
- To emphasize the importance of these standards and the impact of climate change more broadly, many districts have passed resolutions and policies to commit to environmental education.
- Schools are encouraged to teach environmental literacy, which by definition includes climate change, according to state law. The Education Code does not mandate that schools teach it.
- Connecticut's sustainable curriculum fails to properly address the climate crisis and the emergence of sustainable development. Education professionals say the topic is still unfamiliar territory and that there aren't enough resources to incorporate it into their curriculum.
- Produces an environment where people refuse to believe the climate is changing and refuse to believe that scientific evidence proves it is so.
- Shows down methods of sustainable development when people do not believe in climate awareness.

11. IMT-GT UNINET: VIRTUAL STUDENT LEADERS' FORUM (21 APRIL)

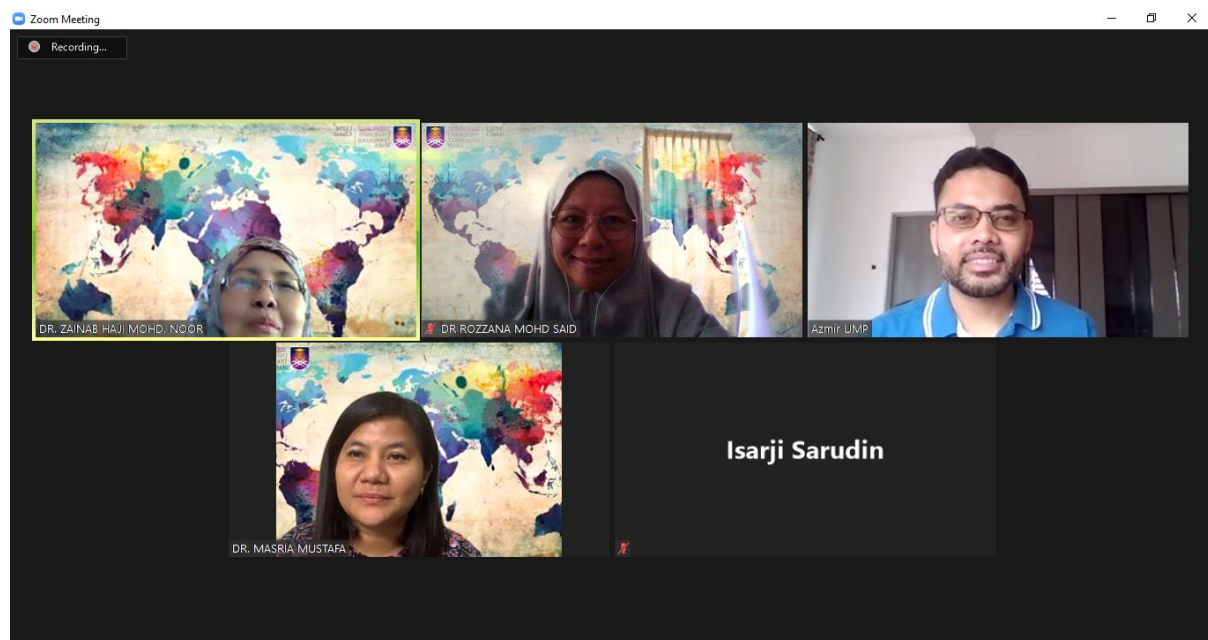

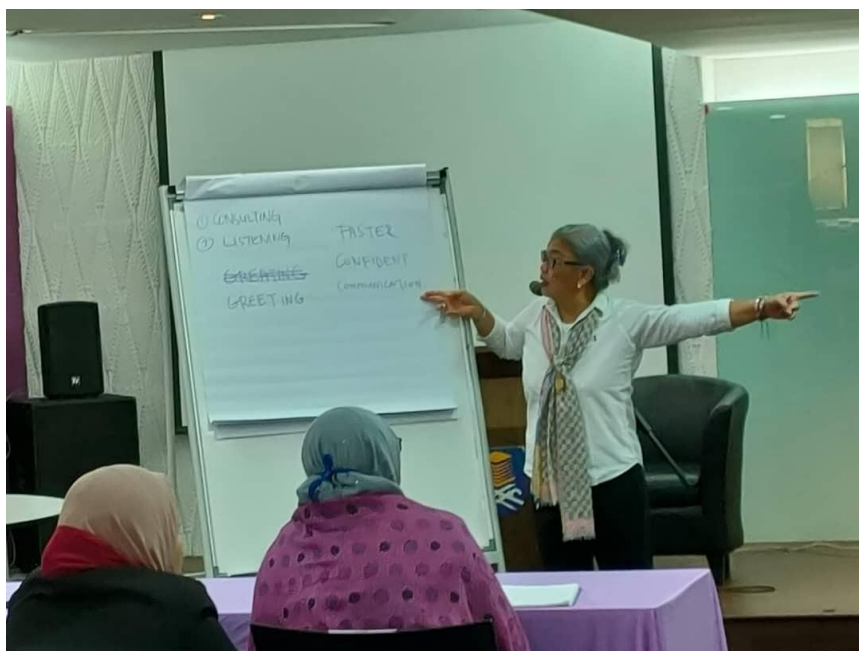
13. NUR RAMADAN: A TASTE OF BUBUR LAMBUK (19 & 20 APRIL)

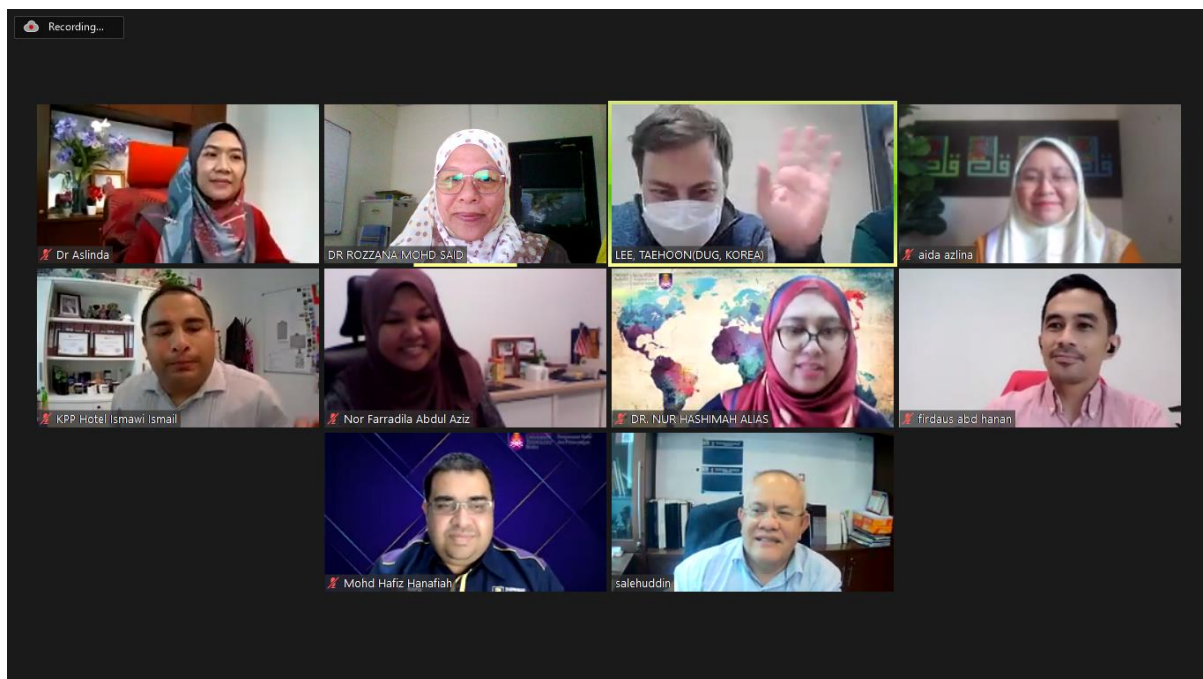


17. UiTM-DONGGUK UNIVERSITY COLLABORATION MEETING (12 APRIL)

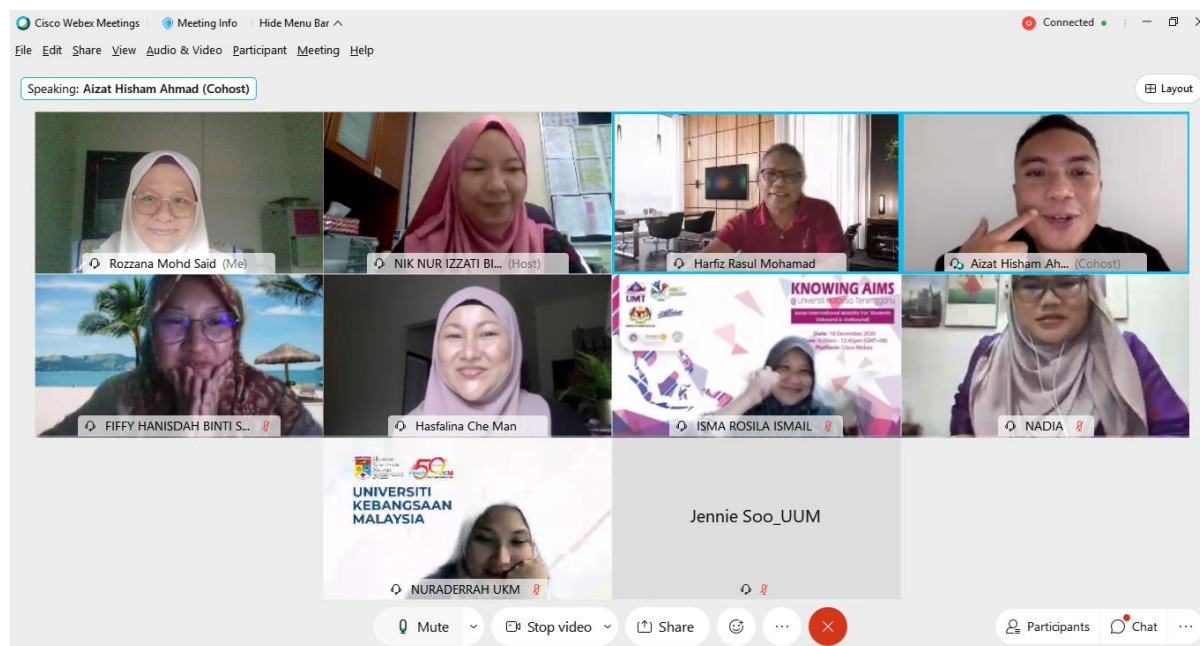
18. MOHE TASKFORCE WORKSHOP FOR EXPO DUBAI 2020 (8 – 9 APRIL 2021)

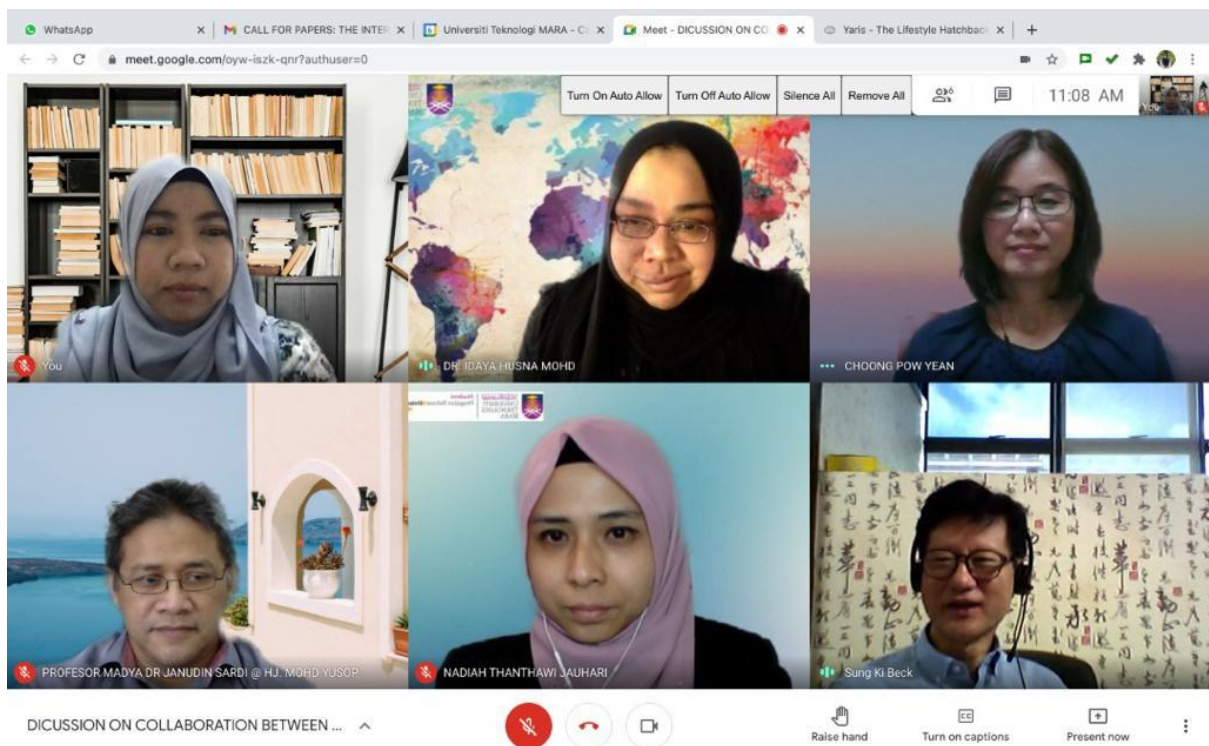
19. AIMS DISCUSSION ON INTERNATIONAL AIMS CONFERENCE (7 APRIL)

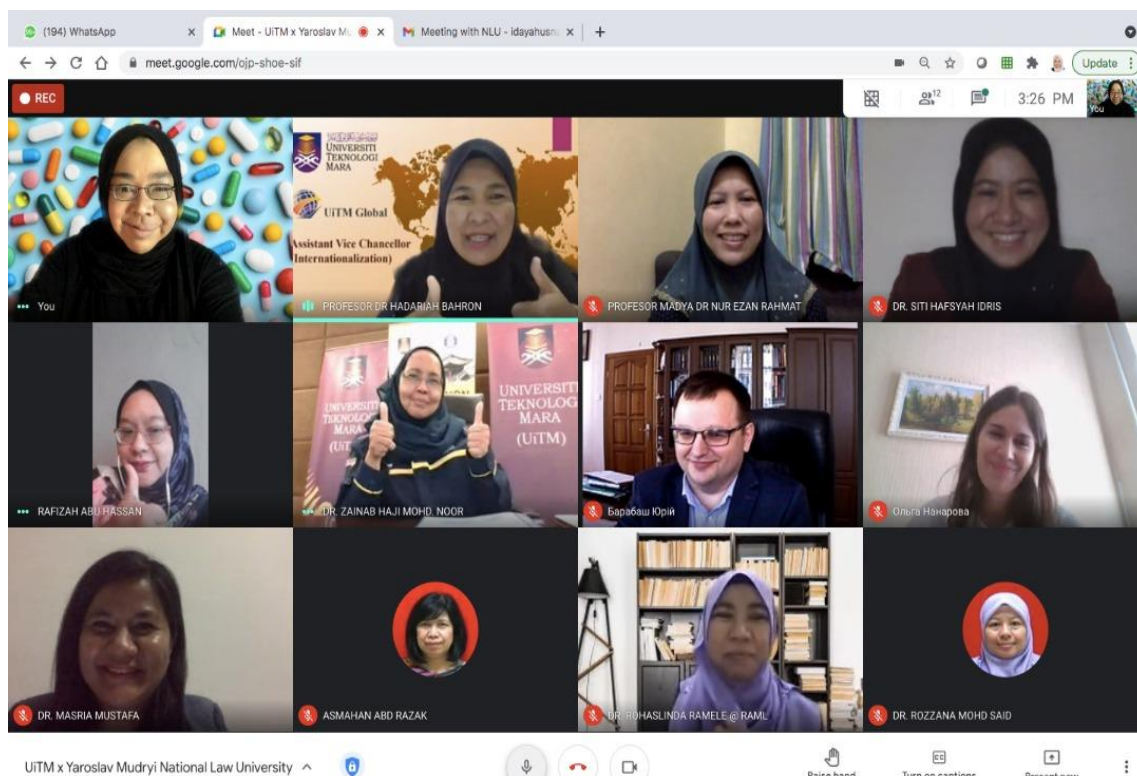
21. SINAR RAMADHAN PROGRAMME (5-6 APRIL)

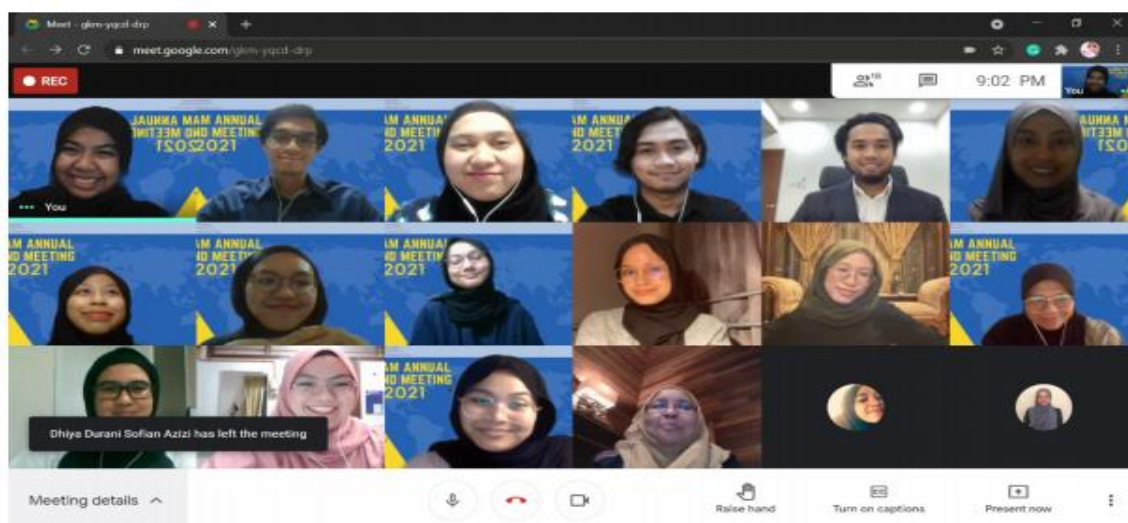
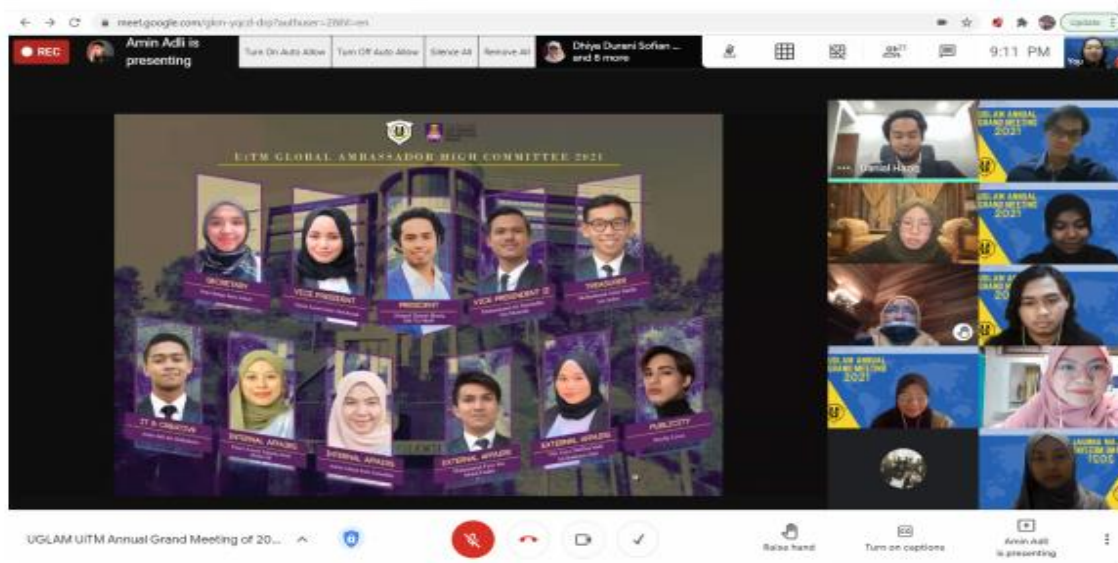
23. ART DIPLOMACY FORUM AND EXHIBITION MEETING 1/2021 (5 APRIL)

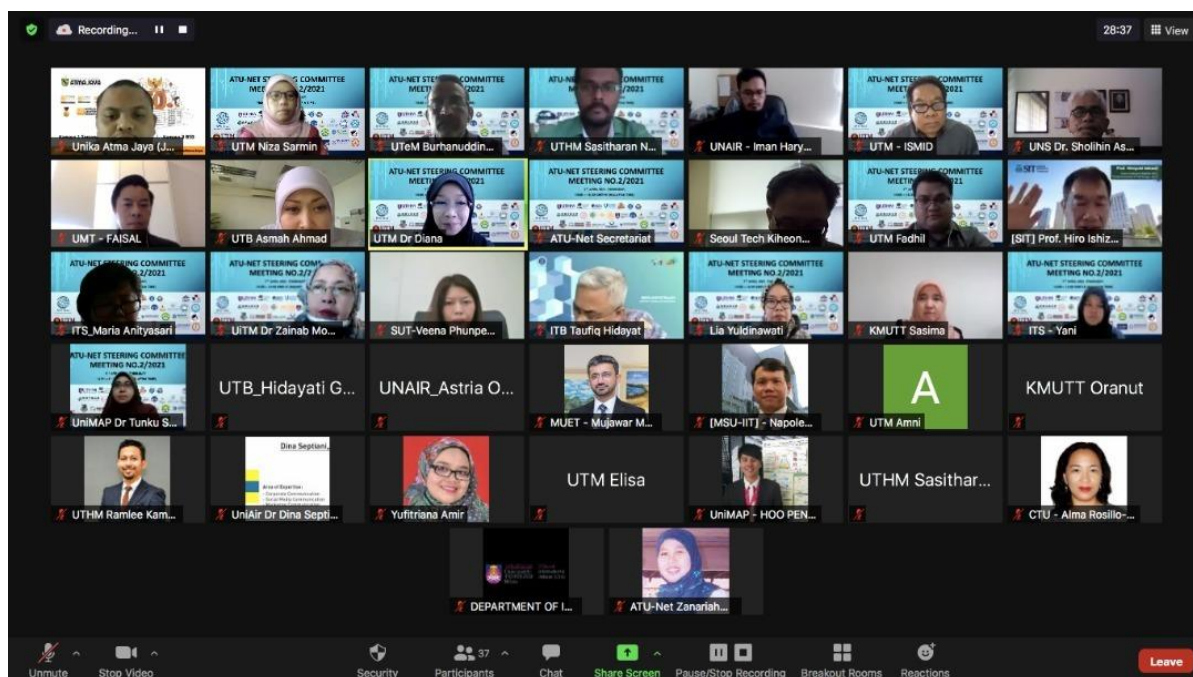

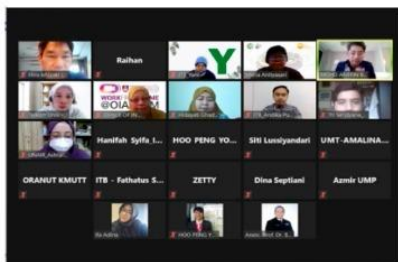

26. ATU-NET STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING 2/2021 (1 APRIL)

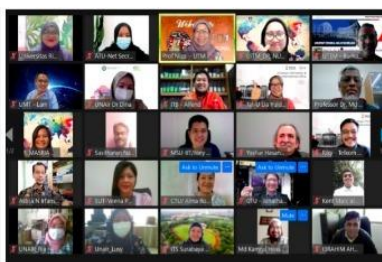
